



RULES FOR SUBMISSION OF ARTICLES

The articles published in *NUCLEAR ESPAÑA*, the magazine of the SNE, shall adhere to the following rules:

1. They shall be originals and will not have been published in other journals. They may be transcriptions of papers presented in conferences and congresses, but in this case they must be adapted to an appropriate format for an article, (e.g., expressions such as “Ladies and gentlemen”, allusions to slides, references to the conference in question, etc. will be omitted). Articles with a clear commercial content shall be avoided.
2. They shall be in accordance with the technical rules indicated below in terms of length, size of the originals, graphics, photographs, etc.
3. The *NUCLEAR ESPAÑA* Editorial Committee is responsible for accepting articles and for including them in an issue of the magazine.
4. The magazine’s Editorial Committee reserves the right to suggest to the authors that they make changes or lengthen or shorten the text for reasonable motives. No changes will be made without the consent of the authors, but in the event of a serious discrepancy the Committee may withdraw the article.
5. The originals will not be returned nor will any correspondence be exchanged with respect there to.
6. The authors assume responsibility for the articles published by them in *NUCLEAR ESPAÑA*.
7. The publication of open letters expressing points of view regarding nuclear issues may be requested. Replicas of the same type will also be admitted, but the magazine’s Editorial Committee reserves the right to interrupt the debate when, in its opinion, it exceeds a reasonable level of disagreement.
8. When deadlines are indicated for the submission of articles, these shall be scrupulously observed without exception.
9. Articles shall be accompanied by the following data provided on a separate sheet:
 - a. Title (Spanish and English).
 - b. Author(s).
 - c. An 80- to 100-word abstract (Spanish and English).
 - d. Keywords (Spanish and English).



Technical Rules

1. The submission shall include the first and last names of the author(s), his current position and the company where he works. If desired he can add a brief professional resume (about twenty words) and a recent photograph. As well as the article abstract (between 80 and 100 words) in Spanish and English shall be included. Unless otherwise expressly indicated, the authors shall be listed in order they are in the original document. If article has more than four authors, their photograph will not be included.
2. The maximum length shall be 3,000 words. The Editorial Committee, subject to advance notice, may modify this length for justified reasons.
3. Article will be sent to the Editorial Committee member who will be the coordinator of every edition and the contact person between author and Committee.
4. Text will be sent in Word format.
5. Graphics and photographs shall be sent in original image files, not inside the text. Photographs shall have a resolution greater than or equal to 300 ppp.
6. Units shall be International System (SI) units, observing the typography recommended by it.
7. The use of words from the nuclear lexicon provided in the following link is recommended: <http://www.sne.es/es/recursos/diccionario-de-terminos-nucleares>.
8. Use of bibliographical references must be limited to strictly necessary and Vancouver standards must be followed. This standards establishing:

Must assign a number to each reference in the order in which they appear in text, i.e. references should be cited in numerical order. Within the text, references are cited by number in brackets. References cited in a table or figure as they have been cited as the table or figure is first mentioned in the text.
